
















Education in Canada

Education in Canada



Canada offers education and research excellence.

Affordable education: international student tuition fees for post secondary degrees may start as low as \$2,000 (Canadian) a year

Canadian education opens doors to employment, business opportunities and life in Canada after your studies.

University Studies



Bachelor's:

3-4 four years of undergraduate study

Master's:

1-2 years of study including a thesis, practicum or research paper, or a course-based program

PhD:

3-5 years of study, including a thesis, usually after the master's degree

Other options include:

Professional degrees, certificates and diplomas—short, career-focused programs

- 2,150 –52,500 CAD/yr or 1.560 –38.100 Euro
- Masters in Engineering & Technology:
- 2,150 -52,500 CAD/yr or 1.560 -38.100 Euro
- Masters in Social Sciences:
- 2,150 –37,000 CAD/yr or 1.560 –27.000 Euro

Certificate:

1 year or less of applied, employment-ready training in a specific field

Diploma:

2-year program offering credential and work-integrated learning

Bachelor, Applied or Associate

Degrees:

2- to 4-year undergraduate programs with an applied focus

Study Permits



- You need a study permit to study in Canada for six months or longer
- You need the following documents to apply:
 - Proof of acceptance
 - Valid passport
 - Proof of financial support for at least your first year of studies
 - Letter of explanation
- There are two ways to apply:
 - Online
 - On paper



- The program costs and information on living expenses: This estimate includes tuition/program fees, books/supplies, groceries, local public transport and miscellaneous costs, accommodation options
